# **RESPONSIBILITY & SAFETY TIPS**

## WARNING .

esulting from any of the inherent dangers and risks of skiing and may not recover rom any ski area operator for any injury resulting from any of the inherent dangers nd risks of skiing including: changing weather conditions, existing and changing now conditions, bare spots, rocks, stumps, trees, collisions with natural objects nan-made objects or other skiers, variations in terrain, and the failure of skiers to ski ithin their own abilities. Colorado law includes cliffs, jumps, extreme and freestyle terrain in the inherent dangers and risks of skiing.

environment. Colorado Law prohibits riding the lifts or skiing while under the influence of alcohol or drugs. Colorado Law requires that you give your name and current address to a ski area employee before you leave the vicinity if you are nvolved in a collision resulting in an injury. Witnesses are encouraged to contact a ki area employee. Do not enter closed lands adjoining a ski area. Winter Park has rero tolerance on closed trail violations. Violator's pass will be revoked for the reason. Do not disembark from a chairlift except at a designated area.

## YOUR RESPONSIBILITY CODE

Always stay in control. You must be able to stop or avoid people or objects. People ahead or downhill of you have the ight-of-way. You must avoid them. Stop only where you are visible from above and do not restrict traffic. Look uphill and avoid others before starting downhill or entering a trail. You must prevent runaway equipment. Read and obey all signs, warnings, and hazard markings. Keep off closed trails and out of closed areas. You must know how and be able to load, ride and nload lifts safely. If you need assistance, ask the lift attendant o not use lifts or terrain when impaired by alcohol or drugs. If ou are involved in a collision or incident, share your contact

ormation with each other and a ski area employee. Winter sports involve risk of erious injury or death. Your knowledge, decisions and actions contribute to your afety and that of others. If you need help understanding the Code, please ask any
